Day 1 Tuesday April 21 – Australia to Fukuoka meals in flight

Today we fly to Fukuoka via Singapore. Flight times and numbers to be advised closer to travel dates.

Day 2 Wednesday April 22 – arrive in Fukuoka B, D

Arrive in Fukuoka and meet our guide and then do an orientation of the city before checking into our hotel. Welcome dinner in the hotel later this evening.

Hotel Rihga Royal Hotel or similar for 2 nights.

Day 3 Thursday April 23 – Fukuoka B, L, D

Today we will visit the interesting traditional Ohori Japanese garden and park area as well as the Fukuoka Castle. We will explore the city from the water with a harbour cruise. Both lunch and dinner will be in local restaurants.

Day 4 Friday April 24 – Fukuoka to Hiroshima B, D

Today we depart Fukuoka to travel to Hiroshima. On the way we will stop to visit the wonderful Kawachi Wisteria Garden. The wisteria should be in full flower when we visit including the famous wisteria tunnel. Our hotel tonight is located right near the famous Peace Park in Hiroshima. Dinner tonight will be in the hotel.

ANA Crowne Plaza Hotel or similar for 2 nights.

Day 5 Saturday April 25 – Hiroshima B

A day to explore Hiroshima. We will visit the Peace Park and Peace museum just near the hotel as well as ground zero near the Atomic dome. Next is the peaceful Shukkeien gardens, one of my favourite Japanese gardens, where the azaleas should be in full flower. We will also visit a quiet local shrine, Mitaki Deri, set in a small valley in Hiroshima that has become a personal favourite. It has peace, a lovely location with cool shady trees, waterfalls and a real sense of place. We will also have free time for shopping and a free evening to explore the local restaurants.

Day 6 Sunday April 26 – Hiroshima to Matsue B, D

Today we take the scenic journey across Japan to Matsue where we will visit the Matsue castle and the historic Samurai house which is in the grounds. We will also take some time to walk on the famous Shiomi Nawate (canal area) to see some beautiful traditional homes and gardens. Dinner will be in the rather beautiful hotel tonight.

Matsue Hotel Ichibata or similar for 2 nights.

Day 7 Monday April 27 – Matsue B, L, D

Today we visit 2 superb gardens. The first is the Yushien garden which is famous for its annual Paeony festival which should be in full swing when we are there and the second is the perfectly manicured Adachi Museum of Arts Garden (pictured left). We will have lunch in a local restaurant and dinner is included in the hotel.





Day 8 Tuesday April 28 – Matsue to Himeji to Kyoto B, D

We leave Matsue to travel to Himeji castle which has been recently restored. It is surrounded by lovely gardens and next door is the Koko-en garden which should have Azaleas in flower when we arrive. Later we will continue to the historic city of Kyoto also known as the garden capital of Japan. Dinner is included in a local restaurant.

New Miyako Hotel or similar for 2 nights

Day 9 Wednesday April 29 – Kyoto B

Today we have a day to explore the highlights of Kyoto including the wonderful Kinkakuji temple, more commonly known as the Golden Pavilion, the Silver Pavilion and the famous Zen rock garden at Ryoanji temple. We will also make a visit to the Kiyomizu-dera temple which has great views over Kyoto.

Day 10 Thursday April 30 – Kyoto to Nagoya B, D

This morning we will visit the Bamboo forest and the lovely Okochi Sanso Villa. This villa is set in the hills overlooking Kyoto and is beautiful. We will have some time for lunch in this area before we depart for a 2 hour drive to the wonderful Nabana No Sato garden near Nagoya. This garden has the largest light show installation that I have ever seen set throughout the spectacular show gardens. We will have time to see the gardens in daylight before having dinner as the light fades and then time to explore the gardens with the illumination show in full swing. Later we will travel into Nagoya to our hotel.

Nagoya JR Gate Tower Hotel or similar for 1 night

Day 11 Friday May 1 – Nagoya to Lake Motosuko B, D

Today we catch a mid morning bullet train to Mishima before continuing to Lake Motosuko. The bullet train will carry us over 240km in a little over an hour. Upon arrival we will check into our traditional Japanese style hotel where we will have some free time to explore, rest or take a hot spa. This hotel should be a great experience with traditional rooms and local traditions. A traditional dinner is included in the hotel dining room.

Motosu View Hotel or similar for 2 nights

Day 12 Saturday May 2 – Lake Motosuko B, D

We are in the heart of Mt Fuji territory today so hopefully the weather gods will be kind and we can get some great views from the Fuji Shiba-sakura festival (Moss Phlox festival pictured front cover) that we will visit. Expect to see colourful carpets of phlox manicured to frame Fuji san. Later will undertake a lake cruise on Lake Motosuko. Dinner will be in our hotel tonight.

Day 13 Sunday May 3 – Lake Motosuko to Tokyo B, D

We plan a relaxed start to the day before travelling via coach to the Shiofune Kannon Temple which is home to the amazing Azalea festival (see picture above with colourful pavilion). Later journey around 80km to our centrally located hotel in Tokyo. Dinner will be in a local restaurant.

Tokyo Dome hotel or similar for 3 nights

Day 14 Monday May 4 – Tokyo B

Today's highlights around Tokyo include the Ueno Park Paeony festival, a visit to a local Bonsai garden, a trip up the panoramic Skytree Tower, the Kaminari Gate and Sensoji temple area for shopping and people watching. Tonight is free to explore the local area.

Day 15 Tuesday May 5 – Tokyo B, L, D

We head out of Tokyo today to firstly visit the Hitachi seaside park north of Tokyo. This is famous for its blue flowered fields of Nemophila that create an incredible floral sight (see picture on right). We will have lunch in this area in a local restaurant. Our next stop is the Ashikaga Flower park most famous for gigantic displays of Wisteria. Wisteria trees, Wisteria tunnels, Wisteria pergolas, wisteria fans and wisteria pots. Should be in full flower and likely to be very popular! We will have a farewell dinner tonight near our hotel.



Day 16 Wednesday May 6 – Tokyo to Australia B and meals in flight

We depart Tokyo to fly home today via Singapore. Flight details to be advised.

Day 17 Thursday May 7 –Australia meals in flight

We arrive home today with time to be advised
