## Day 1 Tuesday April 22 – Australia to Tokyo meals in flight

Today we fly from Brisbane to Tokyo. Upon arrival meet our guide and transfer to our hotel.

*Tokyo Dome hotel or similar for 3 nights* 

Day 2 Wednesday April 23 – Tokyo sightseeing B, D
Today's highlights around Tokyo include a visit to a local Bonsai garden, a trip up the panoramic Skytree Tower, the Kaminari Gate and Sensoji temple area for shopping and people watching. We will then head back to our hotel for our welcome dinner.

### Day 3 Thursday April 24 - Tokyo B, L

We head out of Tokyo today to firstly visit the Shiofune Kannon Temple which is home to the amazing Azalea festival. We will have lunch in this area in a local restaurant before our next visit to the Ashikaga Flower park most famous for gigantic displays of Wisteria. Wisteria trees, Wisteria tunnels, Wisteria pergolas, wisteria fans and wisteria pots. Should be in full flower and likely to be very popular! We will have a free evening upon our return.

### Day 4 Friday April 25 - Tokyo to Nagasaki B, D

This morning we will have some free time in the hotel area. You may decide to visit the Koishikawa Korukuen garden just near the hotel. It is a lovely traditional stroll garden. Around lunch time we will take a flight to Nagasaki. Upon arrival we will do an orientation drive around the city before checking into our hotel which will also host our dinner this evening.

Nagasaki Global View Hotel or similar for 2 nights

### Day 5 Saturday April 26 – Nagasaki B, L

Today we will visit the main sights of Nagasaki including the Peace Park and Museum, undertake a Harbour Cruise to see a different side of the city and also the famous Megane Bashi Bridge for a photo stop. We will have lunch in a local restaurant before heading back to the hotel for a free evening.

### Day 6 Sunday April 27- Nagasaki Kokura B

Drive to the wonderful Kawachi Wisteria Garden. The wisteria should be in full flower when we visit including the famous wisteria tunnel. Next we will go into the older part of Kokura for some free time to wander and buy lunch in one of the many restaurants. Later head back to the hotel before meeting later for a guided walk to the shopping streets near our hotel and the Kokura castle. Dinner is your choice in one of the many restaurants along the way. Hotel Rihga Royal Hotel or similar for 1 night.

### Day 7 Monday April 28 - Kokura to Hiroshima B, L, D

We will depart Kokura and travel the interesting drive to Hiroshima with a stop along the way for refreshments. Upon arrival in Hiroshima we will have an Okonomiyaki lunch in a traditional small style restaurant. After lunch we will visit the Peace Park and Peace museum as well as ground zero near the Atomic dome. Next is the peaceful Shukkeien gardens, one of my favourite Japanese gardens, where the azaleas should be in full flower. Dinner tonight is in our hotel.

### Day 8 Tuesday April 29 – Itsukushima Island visit B

Today we will journey to Itsukushima Island (also known as Miyajima island) to visit the famous Tori gate and shrines as well as ride the cable car to look out over the bay islands towards Hiroshima. Some free time to shop and taste some of the local produce will also be a highlight. Later meet to catch the ferry back to the mainland and on to Hiroshima for a free evening.

### Day 9 Wednesday April 30 – Hiroshima to Matsue B, D

First up today we will visit a quiet local shrine, Mitaki Deri, set in a small valley in Hiroshima that has become a personal favourite. It has peace, a lovely location with cool shady trees, waterfalls and a real sense of place. Next we will take the scenic journey across Japan to Matsue with a lunch stop along the way. Upon arrival we will visit the Matsue castle and some of the local area before checking into our lakeside hotel. Dinner will be in the rather beautiful hotel tonight.

Matsue Hotel Ichibata or similar for 2 nights.

### Day 10 Thursday May 1 Matsue B, L, D

Today we visit 2 superb gardens. The first is the Yushien garden which is famous for its annual Paeony festival which should be in full swing when we are there and the second is the perfectly manicured Adachi Museum of Arts Garden (pictured left). We will have lunch in the most beautiful local restaurant in the Yushien Garden. Dinner is included in the hotel.

### Day 11 Friday May 2 – Matsue to Himeji to Kyoto B, D

We leave Matsue to travel to Himeji castle which as been recently restored. It is surrounded by lovely gardens and next door is the Kokoen garden which should have Azaleas in flower when we arrive. Later we will continue to the historic city of Kyoto also known as the garden capital of Japan. Dinner is included in a local restaurant. New Miyako Hotel or similar for 3 nights

### Day 12 Saturday May 3 - Kyoto B

Today we have a day to explore the highlights of Kyoto including the wonderful Kinkakuji temple, more commonly known as the Golden Pavilion, the Silver Pavilion and the famous Zen rock garden at Ryoanji temple. We will also make a visit to the Kiyomizu-dera temple which has great views over Kyoto. I also hope to visit the interesting Rengeji Temple and garden.

### Day 13 Sunday May 4 – Kyoto B, L

Today we will hope to visit the rarely open Moss Temple. It is quite a sight with many different shades of green creating a tranquil atmosphere. We will also visit the Fox Shrine with plenty of time to climb the hill or visit the shopping street nearby. We will have lunch in the local area. Remainder of the day free.

### Day 14 Monday May 5 - Kyoto to Nagoya B, D

This morning we will visit the Bamboo forest and the lovely Okochi Sanso Villa. This villa is set in the hills overlooking Kyoto and is beautiful. We will have some time for lunch in this area before we depart for a 2 hour drive to the wonderful Nabana No Sato garden near Nagoya. This garden has the largest light show installation that I have ever seen set throughout the spectacular show gardens. We will have time to see the gardens in daylight including the stunning Begonia house. We will then have dinner as the light fades and then explore the gardens with the illumination show in full swing. Later we will travel into Nagoya to our hotel.

### Day 15 Tuesday May 6 - Nagoya to Lake Kawaguchi B, D

Today we catch a mid morning bullet train to Mishima before continuing to Lake Kawaguchi. The bullet train will carry us over 240km in a little over an hour. We will have a chance to have lunch either at the train station or on our visit to Mt Fuji to station 5. We will then travel to our traditional Japanese style hotel. This hotel is a great experience with traditional rooms and local traditions. A traditional dinner is included.

### Day 16 Wednesday May 7 – Lake Kawaguchi B, D

We are in the heart of Mt Fuji territory today so hopefully the weather gods will be kind and we can get some great views from the Fuji Shiba-Sakura festival (Moss Phlox festival pictured front cover) that we will visit. Expect to see colourful carpets of phlox manicured to frame Fuji san. Lunch stop today is in the Oshino Village area. Later we will undertake a lake cruise on Lake Kawaguchi. Our farewell dinner will be in our hotel tonight.

## Day 17 Thursday May 8 – Lake Kawaguchi to Tokyo B, D

After a later start we will drive back to Tokyo with a lunch stop along the way before visiting the Ueno Park Paeony festival and some other Tokyo city sights. Later we will have dinner in the airport before our overnight flight to Brisbane.

### Day 18 Friday May 9 – Arrive in Australia, meals in flight

We arrive home today.
