## **Lots of Lemons Fact Sheet**



Lemon trees are one of the most popular of all fruit trees for the home gardener. The variety Meyer has been one of the favorites traditionally grown by home gardeners. A new form of this old favorite had been on the market now for several years called Lots of Lemons.

This lemon will grow to around 1.5 metres tall and about the same wide. This makes it ideal for use in smaller home gardens or in courtyards.

Other uses for Lots of Lemon include:

- Pot plants in larger containers
- Small hedge in well drained soil
- Topiary
- Dwarf fruit tree orchard

To grow this lemon well (or indeed most other citrus) you should follow these simple ideas

- Plant in full sun
- Prepare the garden soil prior to planting with compost and manure
- Water every couple of days for the first few weeks and then once a week after establishment
- Prune only to keep in shape
- Fertilize with a general purpose or complete fertiliser three times per year in early spring, late spring and autumn
- Make sure that it has great drainage most citrus including this one do not like to have wet roots and may be prone to root rot.
